## NATIVE RIPARIAN SHRUBS OF EASTERN MARIN



Creek dogwood Deciduous leaves to 3", in opposing pairs, prominently veined, purplish in fall. Veins extrude white thread when broken. Small cream flowers in clusters. Ht: to 10ft.



Coffeeberry Evergreen leaves to 3", dark blue-green with parallel veins not reaching leaf edge. Twigs stout, purplebrown. Berries dark, 1/2", oval. Ht: to 8ft.



Snowberry Deciduous, thin, pale green leaves to 11/2" in opposing pairs; usually oval, but variable in shape. Bellshaped flowers white to pink. Berries to 1/2". Ht: to 5ft.



Toyon Evergreen lustrous leaves to 31/2", with short prickles. Twigs stout, reddish-brown. Small white flowers followed by berries in winter. Ht: to 8ft.



Hazel Deciduous leaves to 21/2", coarsely toothed with prominent veins, slightly bristly. Flexible twigs, bristly when young. Male flowers, catkins; female, minute, red. Ht: to 12ft.



Creambush Deciduous leaves to 11/2", oval-diamond shaped, toothed with prominent veins, velvety. Straight, brittle twigs with lighter-colored lines. Ht: to 8ft.

Note: leaf length includes the stalk; 'leaflets' are divisions of a leaf, which, if deciduous, falls as a whole.

## NATIVE RIPARIAN SHRUBS AND VINES OF EASTERN MARIN



**Blue elderberry** Deciduous, foul-smelling leaves 6-12" with 5-9 toothed leaflets. Bark ageing dark, furrowed. Cream flowers and berries in flat-topped bunches. Ht: to



**California blackberry** Semi-deciduous leaves 4" with 3 coarsely-toothed bristly leaflets. Spines straighter, denser, weaker than other common blackberry. Mounds to 5ft.



**California honeysuckle** Semi-deciduous leaves to 2", oblong, often slightly hairy, in opposing pairs. Flowers to 1". Stems trail on ground or twine high into trees, to 1" thick.



**California rose** Deciduous leaflets to  $1\frac{1}{2}$ ", thin pale, toothed and slightly velvety. Thorns straight or curved down. Flowers to  $1\frac{1}{2}$ ". Red fruit (hip) to  $\frac{1}{2}$ ". Ht: to 7ft.



**California pipevine** Deciduous leaves to 5", pale yellowgreen and velvety. Flowers 1½", appearing before leaves. Long velvety stems festoon shrubs or trail on ground.



**Poison oak** Deciduous leaves to 8" with 3 irregularly-lobed leaflets, turning red in late summer. Twigs long and wiry-looking. Toxic resin. Ht: 1-6ft in open, or climbing trees.

Note: leaf length includes the stalk; 'leaflets' are divisions of a leaf, which, if deciduous, falls as a whole.
